

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ABOUT THE Skegness Community Church

Skegness Community Church was set up in October 2008 by the retired Methodist Minister, Rev Ian Banks. Intially the Church was under the oversight and support of the Reffley Community Church of the Nazarene, King's Lynn. The Church of the Nazarene is an international evangelical denomination in the Wesleyan-Holiness tradition, and so in many ways is similar to the Methodist Church. In April 2015 we became a separate registered charity (CIO)(Charity Registration no. 1161383) and in March 2019 we were accepted as a fully organised in the Nazarene Church. In January 2020 we were released from the denomination and became an independent Church Community. At a General Meeting of the members held on 10th April 2022 a new Constitution was agreed as was the change of the name of the CIO to Skegness Community Church.

The new Constitution has been accepted by the Charity Commission.

A Message from the Rev'd Ian Banks The Cost of Our Spiritual Treasure

As September begins, the population of Skegness will drop dramatically as the holidaymakers, many with young families, return to different parts of the country for the start of the "New" school year. I wonder, what impressions and memories will they take home with them? For a few, part of their memory will be of sharing fellowship and or worship with us. Sadly though, the vast majority of holidaymakers will have had no meaningfull contact at all with the Christian community. Worse still, neither will they when they return home.

Last month our worship and preaching theme was Spiritual Treasure, when we looked at what the scriptures tell us about our inheritance as believers - that is Eternal Life. Despite this Spiritual Treasure being available for all to inherit, for those who choose, for whatever reason, not to embrace the riches that our God provides, both now and for eternity, such Spritual Treasure is lost treasure. A life changing opportunity wasted.

However, with anything of great value there is always a cost. So this month I invite each of us to take stock as we explore the **Cost of our Spiritual Treasure**. Sadly, one of the reason why so many people squander their inheritance of eternal life is that they are not prepared to accept the cost.

I invite you all to search for ways in which we can encourage others to discover for themselves the real liberty, the real life, the real wealth of a life given to joyful service in the precious name of Jesus. I urge each of us to be prepare to change, to endeavour to seek the lost; and commit to serving God alone. I also urge you to remember that Jesus is our Source of Hope and that without faith, we have no hope for the future.

The Parables from Luke's Gospel that we shall be reading over the next few weeks are particularly fruitful in this process. In these parables we find connections with our real world of economics and employment, of generosity and greed, of humiliation and hospitality. Luke was there before us, alerting his readers by applying these stories to their circumstances, and he is a good guide as we pray that their significance will be revealed 'among us'.

So as we get back to 'normal' after all the bussiness of the summer season, we give thanks to God for all the Spiritual Treasure He has provided and has promised to provide in the future, and we give thanks for each one of us who have been drawn together in this fellowship - we are truly like a family; for that is indeed what being church is all about; being part of God's big family. Do join us for fellowship and worship and may we all continue to thank the Lord daily for being our Source of Hope.
