ABOUT THE *Skegness Community Church*

Skegness Community Church was set up in October 2008 by the retired Methodist Minister, Rev Ian Banks. Initially the Church was under the oversight and support of the Reffley Community Church of the Nazarene, King's Lynn. The Church of the Nazarene is an international evangelical denomination in the Wesleyan-Holiness tradition, and so in many ways is similar to the Methodist Church. In April 2015 we became a separate registered charity (CIO)(Charity Registration no. 1161383) and in March 2019 we were accepted as a fully organised in the Nazarene Church. In January 2020 we were released from the denomination and became an independent Church Community. At a General Meeting of the members held on 10th April 2022 a new Constitution was agreed as was the change of the name of the CIO to *Skegness Community Church*.

The new Constitution has been accepted by the Charity Commission.

A Message from the Rev'd Ian Banks

I am writing this message two weeks into 2026. Although Elsie and I are having a month's break I'm having to get myself prepared for when we start up again. So as this is my first newsletter of the New Year, the first thing I would like to do is to wish all of you a **very blessed and happy New Year**. Of course this may seem a bit optimistic given the year we have all just experienced! I will not waste time going in to detail as I'm sure you have heard enough about our useless Government, illegal immigration, wars etc. etc., which seem to occupy much of the daily news.

As I have drawn myself back into work mode it has occurred to me that the Christian faith is still being pushed further into the background. But what about this; what if this was to be our Church's best year yet? A New year brings more than a fresh calendar, it brings renewed hope, fresh vision, and a powerful opportunity to move forward with purpose. So as we enter a New Year it is appropriate that we remind ourselves of our Faith, and so our theme for the beginning of this year will be **"Back to Basics"**, We will begin by revisiting the Beatitudes as spelt out by Jesus in His Sermon on the Mount. Jesus sets out very plainly the attitudes we should have and makes it clear that throughout this earthly life we must **Walk Humbly with Our God**.

When we come to know Jesus as our personal Saviour, we realise that he is the key to Christian Living which leads to eternal life.

Whatever New Year's resolutions we might make, nothing compares to renewing our Covenant Commitment to God. Many denominations have adopted John Wesley's **Covenant Prayer** as a way of renewing that Covenant. I will be inviting you to participate in that *Covenant Prayer* at our meeting on the 25th January and both the prayer and the Beatitudes are included as a supplement to this month's newsletter.

God's desire for each of us that we should walk humbly with our God, as we shine His Light on our troubled world, living a life of integrity, always living and feeling close to God and, most of all, ALWAYS trusting God - . Do join us for worship as we all get back to basics in our journey into the Lord and Saviour of our lives. God bless you all.
